

Marlborough Man Receives Prostate Cancer Care During the COVID-19 Pandemic



Earlier this year, David Chase, a retired Connecticut Department of Transportation civil engineer, went for his annual physical and learned that his regular PSA test result was double the normal range. After more than a decade of being in remission, his prostate cancer had returned.

David knew he wanted to receive treatment close to his home in Marlborough. Over the years, he and his wife had positive experiences using the Middlesex Health Marlborough Medical Center, so he requested a referral to a Middlesex Health urologist.

“Things moved along very well,” David said when recalling the many tests, MRIs and bone scans that were required for planning his cancer treatment. “I’ve been very happy with Middlesex’s service and care.
