
MIDDLESEX HEALTH COMMUNITY BENEFIT REPORT 2020

Middlesex Health's Community Benefit programs provide us with the opportunity to fulfill our commitment to improving the health and well-being of the communities we serve. Each year, Middlesex Health collects data based on its programs and services that meet specific community benefit criteria, which include responding to identified health and well-being needs, access issues, barriers to care and serving vulnerable populations.

Middlesex Health understands the importance of measuring community health and uncovering barriers to care, promoting health equity, creating evidence-based initiatives that respond to identified need, and collaborating with community partners to develop meaningful and sustained health improvement. Given this, a key component of our community benefit activities is conducting a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) every three taxable years. Our CHNA Implementation Strategy serves to guide targeted initiatives based on identified community need.

In 2020, Middlesex Health's Community Benefit totaled \$52,272,141 with 111,403 served.



The above financial data is for fiscal year October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 and reflects the data included in Middlesex Health's Schedule H of the IRS Form 990 for this time period.

The above values do not include Community Building, which is \$12,756 with 92,280 served for fiscal year 2020.
